## **Acute Support Package Eligibility**



Veterans and veteran family members may be eligible for the Acute Support Package if they meet certain eligibility criteria, and it is appropriate to grant a package of supports to help them and their family adjust to new and challenging life circumstances.

Timeframe and funding limits for supports	Services may be funded to a maximum of:  • \$7,500 in the first 12-month period; and  • \$5,000 in the second 12-month period.  Support may be paused and restarted for a total of 24 months over a 48-month period.  Immediately after the 24 months, the family may access up to four courses of counselling every 12 months for a continuous 36-month period.			Services may be funded to a maximum of:  \$27,835 in the first 12-month period; and \$27,835 in the second 12-month period.  Support is for a continuous 24-month period.	
Support for children of veterans	Children can receive support through the funding amounts outlined above. In addition, children can receive further funding amounts for services up to a maximum of:  \$10,000 every 12 months for a child not yet attending primary school; or \$5,000 every 12 months for a child attending primary school but not yet attending high school until the child commences high school.

- <sup>1</sup> A relevant payment includes: Incapacity Payments under the DRCA or MRCA, SRDP under the MRCA, a Special or Intermediate rate of Disability Compensation Payment, or Veteran Payment under the VEA.
- <sup>2</sup> A former partner of a deceased veteran (i.e. someone who was not in a relationship with the veteran at the time of their death) is not eligible for the Acute Support Package.
- <sup>3</sup> A related person of a veteran, including a current partner, does not have to reside in the same household as the veteran to be eligible for the Acute Support Package. The DVA website includes a list of people who are defined under the legislation as a related person of a veteran at: www.dva.gov.au/asp
- <sup>4</sup> A bereaved partner includes a Wholly Dependent Partner under the MRCA or a Spouse under the DRCA or a War Widow(er) under the VEA.
